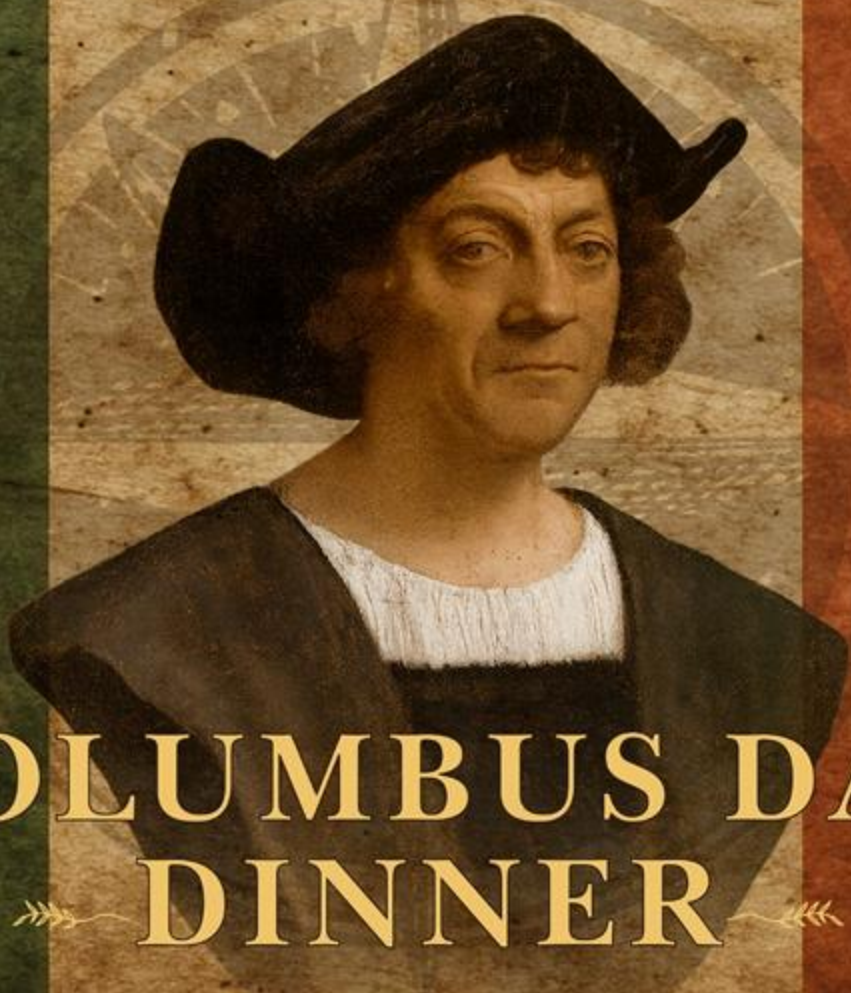

Italian Roots on the World Stage

A World Cup Star's Family Connection to Italy

Being a member of Roma Lodge is quite an honor. We may not realize it, but through our affiliation, we proudly acknowledge our great heritage and all the famous Italians.

Recently, the world stage has been focused on FIFA World Cup soccer. Even if you are not a soccer fan, the media makes it difficult to ignore. Even I, with a limited soccer background, have somewhat followed the results. I see that the United States has been eliminated, but I was proud of the fact that the team represented our great country.

A name that I keep hearing is a soccer standout on the Argentina team. His name is Lionel Messi, and it seems that he is one of the greatest players in this competition. I was curious and looked up his heritage, and I found some interesting history about him. Of course, he is Italian—no surprise there.

Messi's Italian roots are closely associated with the Province of Macerata, particularly the area around Recanati and nearby coastal Porto Recanati. His paternal great-grandfather, Angelo Messi, emigrated from this area to Argentina in 1883. Some research has also linked his maternal family, the Coccettini/Cuccittini family, to San Severino Marche.

The Marche region produced many emigrants who left for Argentina during the late 1800s. Messi's ancestors were among those families. Today, both Recanati and San Severino Marche celebrate this connection. In 2022, San Severino Marche even granted Messi honorary citizenship because of his maternal family's roots there.

If your family is from Ascoli Piceno, there is a good chance your ancestors came from the same broader region of Italy as Messi's, although from a different province. The provinces of Macerata and Ascoli Piceno share many historical, cultural, and architectural traditions and are connected by the old hill towns of the Marche region.

I thought I would share this information. Yes, this is who we are: Roma Lodge!

Louis Joseph Arnone, age 94, passed away peacefully early Friday morning, July 10, 2026 at *Siena on the Lake Assisted Living*.

A lifetime resident of Racine, Wisconsin, he was born on March 23, 1932, to the late Joseph and Emelia (nee: Aceto) Arnone. He graduated from Sacred Heart, St. Catherine's High School and Gateway Technical College. He faithfully served our country in the United States Navy in 1952 and was transferred into the US Marine Corps as a hospital corpsman medic until 1956 when he was discharged as a Petty Officer First Class..

On May 17, 1958 at St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church in Brighton, Wisconsin, Louis was united in marriage with Joan M. (nee: Fox) Arnone. With a profound work ethic, Lou was employed by WE Energies as a Senior Property Record Analyst for over 32 years. Surviving are his loving wife of 68 years, Joan; their children, David (Nan) Arnone, Donald (Kathy) Arnone and Carrie (Scott) Fregien; grandchildren, David (Lorraine), Sophie and Emelia Arnone; great-granddaughter, Amelia Arnone; nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

In addition to his parents, Lou was preceded in death by Joan's parents, Peter and Blanche (nee: Brandes) Fox; brother-in-law, Richard Fox and sister-in-law, Carole (Bill) Cavanaugh.

A memorial Mass was celebrated on Tuesday, July 21, 2026 at 11:00 am at St. Paul The Apostle Catholic Church, 6400 Spring Street in Racine. Military honors and a luncheon followed. Visitation took place at St. Paul Church on Tuesday from 10-11 am (Brothers of Roma Lodge offered a brief tribute at 10:30 am). Private entombment was planned to take place at Southern Wisconsin Veterans Memorial Cemetery. Memorials to St. Catherine's High School or St. Paul the Apostle Parish have been suggested.

A heartfelt note of thanks to longtime physician and friend, Dr. Robert Gullberg & staff; and to the team at Ascension All Saints 3rd Floor for the compassionate care and support given in Lou's time of need. May God bless all of you!

If you recognize individuals in these photos, or have memories, stories or connections to the events shown, I would love to hear from you.

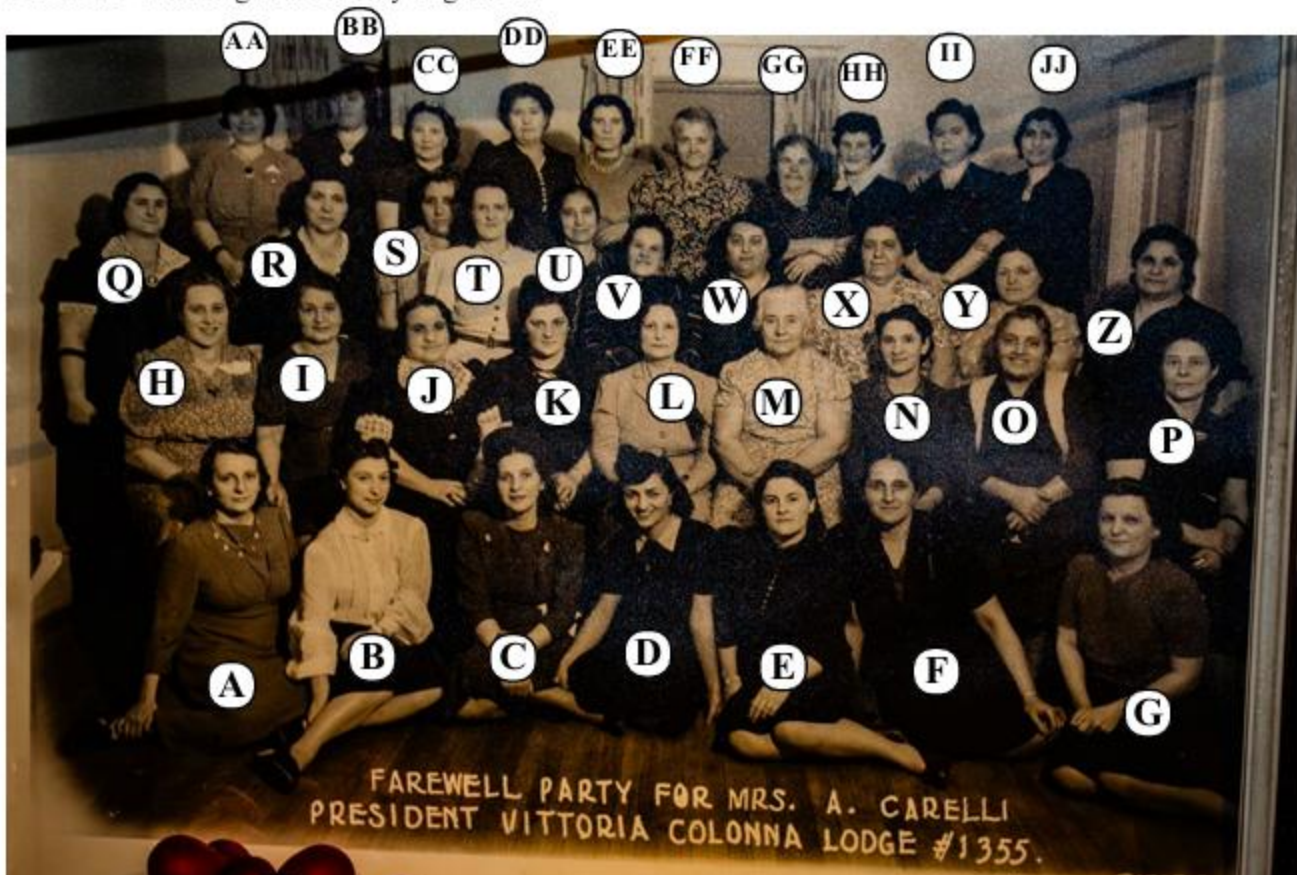
Who are the people in the photo? What was the occasion? What do you remember about that time at Roma Lodge? Even small details can help bring these moments back to life.

Memorabilia includes sports cards, autographs, Star Wars, Pokemon, bobbleheads, NASCAR, other non-sports fun and so much more. We feature an entertaining auction running simultaneously around 9:45am until 11:30am with a large variety of items. Every show brings different surprises! There may be "signing" guests at some of our shows as well. Please pass along the word to friends and family!

If YOU have a few items to sell (up to 8 "lots") come early and ask me or MIKE if you could submit them into the auction (15% commission to charity) – and walk away with money. Honestly, what are they doing stuffed away in boxes? Bring them – sell them – make a collector happy (it's either that or your kids might sell them for a DOLLAR at their Rummage Sale)!

WSCA has fostered a great niche in the sports collecting business by combining our shows with charitable giving. 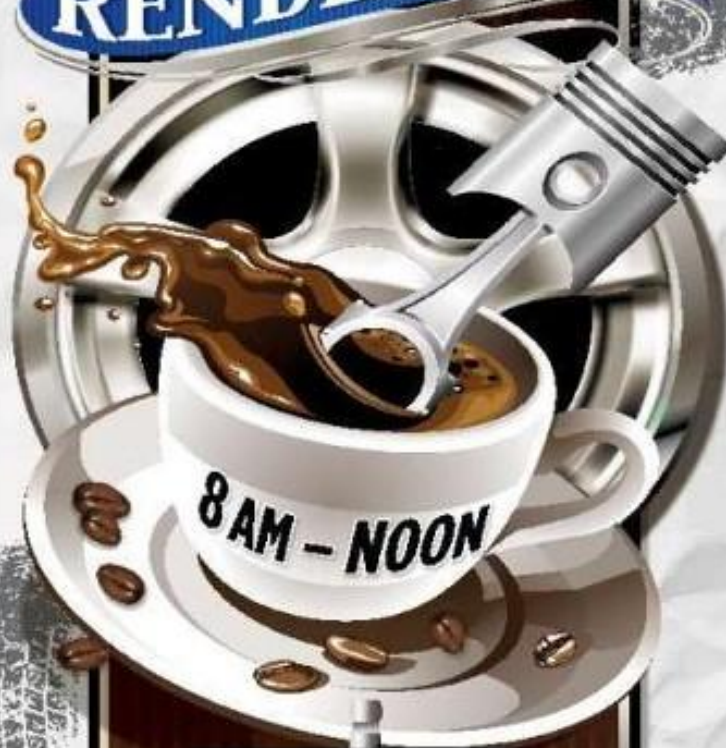
