OBITUARIES

Rosalbino "Bino" Ammendola August 16, 1939 – February 19, 2025



Bino Ammendola of Kenosha, Wisconsin passed away peacefully in his sleep on February 19, 2025, at his winter home in Englewood, Florida. He was born in **Decollatura**, Province of Catanzaro, Italy on August 16, 1939, to Vincenzo and Marietta (Perri) Ammendola.

Bino lost his father in the war when he was three years old. At age eight, he and his mother moved to Argentina for three years. They returned to Italy, and at age fifteen the family moved to Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan to join a large step-family, the Bonacci's. In 1958 he moved to Kenosha with his brother Tony and a friend to find work.

He worked for AMC/Chrysler in various material handling jobs and retired after thirty years as a supervisor. In his retirement he built a spec house with a friend, and worked for St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Mary's Churches demonstrating his woodworking and maintenance skills, retiring at age 70.

Bino attended school in Italy, Sault Ste. Marie and Gateway Technical College in Kenosha. He also had apprenticed as a fine wood worker and tailor while in Italy.

Bino proudly served in the U.S. Marine Corp. He spent six months on active duty and seven years in the reserve. He was stationed at Parris Island in South Carolina and later, Camp Pendleton in California.

He was united in marriage to Karen (Schuch) on September 25, 1965, at St. Thomas Aguinas Church. They would have celebrated sixty years together in September. Together they raised three children, Edward, Tina and Lisa. Bino was a member of St. Thomas Aguinas Church and then St. Mary Catholic Church. For over 30 years he was a member of Roma Lodge in Racine, Wisconsin. He played soccer for a Milwaukee team and was a Golden Gloves boxing champ in his youth. He enjoyed bowling, golfing and was a championship bocce player. Bino was an avid gardener, who shared his delicious harvest with family and friends. His fine woodworking skills are on display in many homes, as Bino would never hesitate to lend a hand with building or fixing something. One of his pride and joys was a '57 Corvette Convertible. Bino took great delight in having family and friends at their vacation homes in Wild Rose and Wautoma. Bino and Karen loved to travel and visited many relatives in Italy, France, Belgium and Australia. They also enjoyed trips to Alaska, the Hawaiian Islands, Central America, the Panama Canal and several Caribbean Islands.

The twinkling, mischievous blue eyes and smile will be dearly missed by his wife, Karen; children, Edward (Valeriane) Ammendola, Tina (Hugh) Rafferty and Lisa (Robert) Dixon; grandchildren, Madeline (Dan) Laken, Owen Rafferty, Calvin Eickstaedt, Melanie Ammendola, Daniel Ammendola, David Ammendola and Monica Ammendola; step-grandson, Tyler (Maranda Marcelain) Dixon; great-granddaughter, Quinn Marie Laken; step-great-grandchildren, Weston Cadeau, Brielle Dixon, and Camille Dixon; brother, Carmine (Debra) Bonacci; sister, Anna (Donald) Slater; sister-in-law, Jean Ammendola; and many nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.

Alan "Jim" Faraone, 82, of Kenosha passed away on April 10, 2025, at Hospice House surrounded by his loving family.

Jim was born on July 25, 1942, in Kenosha, the son of the late A. James and Helen (Cole) Faraone. He graduated from Bradford High School on June 9, 1960. Jim attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison from August to December of 1960. He served in the United States Navy from January 10, 1961, until January 8, 1965, where he graduated boot camp in San Diego and was assigned to the USS St. Paul ported out of Yokosuka Japan for 1 ½ years and San Diego, CA for 1 year. Jim became a licensed real estate broker in 1978. Jim became injured doing volunteer work and retired in 1989. He continued to

find ways to use his skills as a master craftsman and it showed in all of his projects.

Jim married JoDell Grandow on September 29, 1973, celebrating 52-years of marriage.

Jim was a member of the Roma Lodge from 2000-2025 where he served on the Board of Directors from 2002-2018. Jim also ran Bingo from 2017-2024. He found passion in the Building and Grounds Committee and his work can be seen throughout the property. Jim enjoyed the people at bingo and strived to make it more rewarding for both the players and workers. Jim was a member of the Kenosha Elks from the 1970's as well as being a lifetime member of the Kenosha VFW. Jim joined the Kenosha Moose Lodge in 2021 where he enjoyed being a member of the Moose community and also volunteered for Bingo.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS ANNOUNCEMENT



The Buildings and Grounds committee has recommended the reroofing of the section of roof that currently covers the "Public" kitchen and the replacement of three (3) roof top units located on said roof. One (1) roof top unit was replaced last July as it had failed and was unrepairable. The three remaining units are of the same age and condition as the one replaced.

The roof will be taken off, any damage underneath will be repaired or replaced and the area (approx. 2,788 square feet) will be roofed with a new 90 mil EDPM product with a 30-year labor and materials warranty. This does not mean the roof will never leak, it means the product and the installation are warranted to be free of defect for 30 years.

The requested amount for this project is two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars. (\$225,000)

Per the by-laws of Roma Lodge, the project was discussed at the March Membership Meeting and was voted upon at the April Membership meeting. RESULT – **The expenditure was approved.**
