PETER CIARAMITA – 23rd President (Served 1 term – 1999-2000)



This all started in June 1974. I went into a partnership with Vern Haag and purchased Crown Drug. One of our customers was Sam Fiorita. As time went by, Sam and I would chat and one day Sam suggested in conversation that we may be related. We did some digging and sure enough, some of his Chicago relatives were related to some of mine. We laughed about how small of a world it is, that strangers who met by chance could be related! The discovery of our similar roots and Italian heritage led him to invite me to consider being a member of the Roma Lodge organization and he would be my proponent.

So, in 1978 I became an official member of Roma Lodge. After being accepted as a member, Sam and his wife Helen invited Lynne and I to many member events. We frequently were accompanied by Helen and Russ Missurelli, Ernie and Mary Rossi, and Mike and Pauline Gallo. Each one of them was always so welcoming and that initial group of new friends helped to solidify the fact that we wanted to be a part of such an amazing organization as well as the camaraderie and community that came along with it.

Over the course of the next few years, we celebrated so many special events with this group, among other members we became close with. Many special days of the year were spent socializing with them. Whether it was a Valentine's Day dinner or a Christmas party, a great time was had, and these new friends were quickly becoming friends for life.

Over those years, our new bunch of friends continuously encouraged me to apply for a director position on the board of Roma Lodge. I recall them giving many reasons, but the fact that I was a business owner was one! I eventually took their advice and ran. I didn't think too much about what would happen if I weren't elected, I just ran for it anyhow! I was nominated and on the night of the election, I was announced as one of the winners. Frank Nicotera was a fellow board member elected at the same time as me. As new board members interestingly enough we both suggested an audit as one of our first orders of business. Unfortunately, that audit discovered a situation that was detrimental to the financial resources of the club that required action immediately. The entire community was shocked, and in some cases was met utter disbelief by current board members. All in all, the situation went to trial and Roma Lodge prevailed! Our first suggestion as members was nothing short of dramatic! Our community was grateful that could fix this issue and move forward.

As time went on, I was asked to run for Vice President of Roma Lodge by Frank Bisotti. I served under Frank's presidency for two terms. At the end of Frank's tenure of presidency, I was approached by both Frank and Ben Yanzito to run for an additional office, but they didn't specify at the time. I thought it was vice president again. Unbeknownst to me, their suggestion was for me to run for president! Once I found out their intention, I was truly humbled and flattered. I ran and wasn't sure what the outcome would be. I was notified by Tom Braun of my win, in an unusual and unforgettable way. Tom, who had been in charge of the election called me in Hawaii to let me know! Lynne and I had won our trip to Hawaii to see the Pro Bowl trough the Rotary Organization and that was where we were at the time. Needless to say, I was pleased and Proud! Ultimately, I ended up serving as the 23rd president of Roma Lodge for the years 1999 and 2000. During my presidency, I recall many small victories as well as challenges. I am proud to say that the Hall of History was founded and created during my tenure.

Roma Lodge was not only a special place for me, but for my entire family. As children, my kids still talk about working at the festival every summer. Whether it was working the soda booth and taking tickets, helping Lynne and I make fried dough, making Italian cookies to sell, or selling raffle tickets, that special weekend in July will always be in all our great memories. As a family, dinners in the member lounge on the weekends were almost always followed by a grasshopper drink and a game of bocce. Lynne and I loved playing in couple's bocce leagues on Sunday nights together as well. Both of my daughters held their wedding receptions in the banquet hall! Many of our most important occasions were celebrated at Roma Lodge.

My wife Lynne was a member of Vittoria Colona for many years and served as VC president during the years 2006 and 2007.

As I reflected on the past, I never quite knew the impact our membership at Roma had on our family. When my son Jeff was 21 years old, I got my clue. It was that year that he came to me and told me he wanted to become a member of Roma Lodge. When I asked him why, he said "I enjoyed my childhood attending events at Roma and always wanted to be a member someday when I became and adult." He continued that he was proud of his Italian heritage and wanted to join his fellow Italians to support our community. To this day, Jeff continues to be a member of Roma Lodge.

So many years later, I can easily say becoming a member of this organization was hands down one of the best decisions. I look back with fondness having all these years as a member and with a sense of accomplishment being fortunate enough to be President for a period of time. Looking forward, my hope for the Roma Lodge is that their success drives into the future. The banquet hall space has always been an important source of Roma's Success. As times change, we need to continue to find unique ways to reinvent ourselves.

JOE PORCARO – 24th President (Served 2 terms – 2001, 2002-2004)



My name is Joe Porcaro. I have been a member since 1955. My proponent was my father, Herman Porcaro. We lived on Blake Ave. My first memory of Roma Lodge is when they were on the corner of Forest and Albert. I went with my Dad and put a penny in the slot machine and won 60cents.

Before they built a new place on Forest St., we used to play ball and basketball in that field. We used to hit from the Forest St. side towards the alley. I remember hitting the ball over the fence in the alley and breaking Joe Venterini's garage window. We also played basketball with a 16-inch ball. The basket was a 5-gallon can with the bottom cut out and was attached to a post in the middle of the field.

When I was 19, My Dad said that it was time to become a member of the Lodge. I played softball for Roma Lodge, both 12 and 16 inch. Zuddy DeRose was the pitcher.

In 1958, I started working for my father-in-law, Ed Hermes, at Hermes Hdwe. and Marine. Besides the Hardware store, we opened up the Marine business. We sold boats, lawn mowers, etc.

My Dad started the first Festival when we were on Forest St. Our four kids (Paul, Peter, Perry, and Pam) helped Grandpa with running errands, especially to the Hardware store, and in general, helping to set up the site. I got Lawn-Boy to donate a mower for the raffle. They continued to do that for a couple years.

My Brother, brothers-in-law and I ran the outside liquor bar. My Dad told us that if we had a drink to be sure to pay for it. My Mother, Irene, was in charge of the Bakery booth with her daughters and daughters-in-law helping out. She made all the filling for the Cannolis. My wife, Judy and my sister, Diane, would walk through the crowd selling them.

When I was on the board, Joe Pulice was talking to the guys. And they think I should run for Vice President with Ralph Nicotera the 3rd. At the time, there was talk that Jacobsen (where Ralph worked) was going to move out of Racine. Ralph didn't think that would happen, so I decided to run for VP. Actually, we ran unopposed. It was just a short time later that Jacobsen did move out of town and so did Ralph and there I was. I served the rest of his term and then I ran unopposed again and served another 2 years. During that time, we accomplished a lot at the Lodge: new members bar room, new tables and chairs for this bar room, warehouse, outside drive-thru, bathrooms, all new carpeting, new floor tile, and much more.

I have been captain of the Meatball Bomber booth at the Festival since it moved to the lakefront. I also worked Bingo for over 20 years.

DON CICERO – 25th President (Served 2 terms – 2005-2006, 2007-2008)



Growing up on the southside of Racine I didn't know many Italians until someone told me that there was and Italian Club on the northside of town. A friend of mine, Jerry Wells, talked me into going there to see what was going on. At the time we were not old enough to join the club, but we did meet a lot of Italians. Ron and Ray Guarascio, Rich and Dom Anzalone, John Domanico, Joe and Zuddy DeRose, John Lapetina, Jim Fucilla, Rico Policicchio, Frank Bovi, Joe and Nick Romano, Rich Fazzari, just to name a few. We were all about the same age. Some have moved on for better jobs and sadly some have passed on.

When I became old enough to become a member I joined and was so proud. I think Zuddy DeRose was my proponent. Back then dues were a dollar a month. On weekend nights we would always meet at Roma Lodge and decide what we were going to do and where we going to go. Many times, we would stay right there and play bocce or cards. Sometimes we would shoot craps on the pool table. Hardly anybody use it to play pool. There was also an older gentleman who tended bar, his name was Lawrence Cemarda, it would take him five minutes to serve one beer, but everybody liked him, and we didn't mind waiting. Many nights we would close the bar and I would give Lawrence a ride home, as he lived on the south side of Racine also. We had a softball team during the summer. We were pretty good and the opposition like to play against us because we always invited them to come to Roma after the game. They liked the lower bar prices and sometimes Frances Pulice would serve pasta. They were impressed, Frances was an excellent cook. It's hard to believe but that little building held 300 people. Just ask Lou and Joan Arnone, they got married there as many others did.

In 1960 I was drafted into the Army and after two years of active duty I returned home and couldn't wait to go back to Roma Lodge. The first thing I wanted to do was pay my dues. After trying to find out how much I owed, someone (I don't remember who it was) said my dues were paid in full and I was up to date. I'm not sure if there is a rule. If there isn't there should be. (If a member goes into the military his dues should be paid unit he gets out). Many of the same guys were still there and things were almost back to normal.

In 1970 I married my wife Rosemary and while raising a family I still managed to stay somewhat active at Roma. As time went on the neighborhood was beginning to change and we knew had to do something. I believe it was a general consensus among the membership, that we have a festival to raise money and perhaps find a new clubhouse or maybe even build. I don't think anyone realized how successful those festivals turned out to be. Rainfair which was across the street, allowed us to use their parking lot to park cars. We used our parking lot for events and sausage and meatball bombers and that allowed us to use the indoors for food and entertainment as well. Cars were also lined up on both side of the street. The success of the festivals at our old club allowed us to purchase the land on Spring Street, where we are today.

After a while plans were made available on paper. Herman Porcaro who spearheaded the building project on the new lodge, showed me the plans. To me it was perfect. It looked like an Italian Villa in Italy with the rounded archways. He definitely had my approval, but many were against it because they lived in the neighborhood and didn't want the club to leave, and we really didn't blame them for that. Others said we couldn't afford it. We knew we were going to lose some members in the process, so we formed a membership committee to try and seek out new members. Angelo Casciaro was the chairman; I was on the committee. I think we found at least 10 new members that joined at that time. After the new lodge was finished, we didn't lose as many members as we thought we would. Soon after our lodge began to grow.

Once we were settled, we started having festival downtown at the Festival Hall and grounds. Dick Curty and I started another product, along with sausage and meatball bombers, we added beef bombers. Dick had the perfect recipe for the beef bombers. Dick has since passed on, but we still use his recipe today. I had the honor of being captain of that booth. My son Joe now holds that position.

In 2005 I had a humbling experience of becoming your 25th president. Because of the great board we had and the cooperation of our membership, we were able to get some things done. I also became a member of Wisltalia which promotes teaching Italian in the Wisconsin schools and universities. Members of Wisltalia included the Italian clubs of Madison, Milwaukee, Kenosha and even Green Bay. Often when we held meetings, right here at Roma Lodge, I liked showing them around. Most of them marveled at what they saw, and they often said, how were we able to build this beautiful structure? I really didn't have a good answer because sometimes I wondered myself. Being a member of Wisltalia was a good experience because I believe it helped bring the Wisconsin Italian American clubs closer together.

I enjoyed my time as president, but those years went by so fast I could not believe it. All to soon it was time to pass the gavel on. If I had any advice to give, it would be enjoy your time in the office, whatever your position is on the board, try to reason with each other. Have courage and don't be afraid to take some well-thought-out chances. When I was a working man, my

boss had a plastic turtle on his desk with an inscription along the side of it. It read (notice the movement of the turtle, it only makes progress when it sticks its neck out). Sometimes that could apply to us.

Let us hope and pray that this pandemic will soon be over so we can get on with the business at hand.
